Ephesians 2:11-16

Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called "the uncircumcision" by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands—remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility.

Spring Theological Conference: We are pleased to announce that Dr. Keith Evans will lead a two-day conference at Scots Kirk Presbyterian on May 16 – 17 (Fri-Sat) on the topic of Spiritual Gifts. Entitled "The Spirit's Gifts in the Age of the Word: Strength for the Church Militant,". Dr. Evans will give a distinctly Reformed perspective on the use of all the spiritual gifts given to the body of Christ in the antagonistic climate of spiritual warfare. Friday's teaching will consist of two lectures from 6:30 – 9:00 PM and Saturday three sessions from 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM, with food and childcare provided. Dr. Evans is Associate Professor of Christian Counseling at Reformed Theological Seminary in Charlotte, North Carolina and formerly professor of biblical counseling, director of the Biblical Counseling Institute, and academic dean at the Reformed Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Dr. Evans earned his Ph.D. in biblical counseling at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky.
