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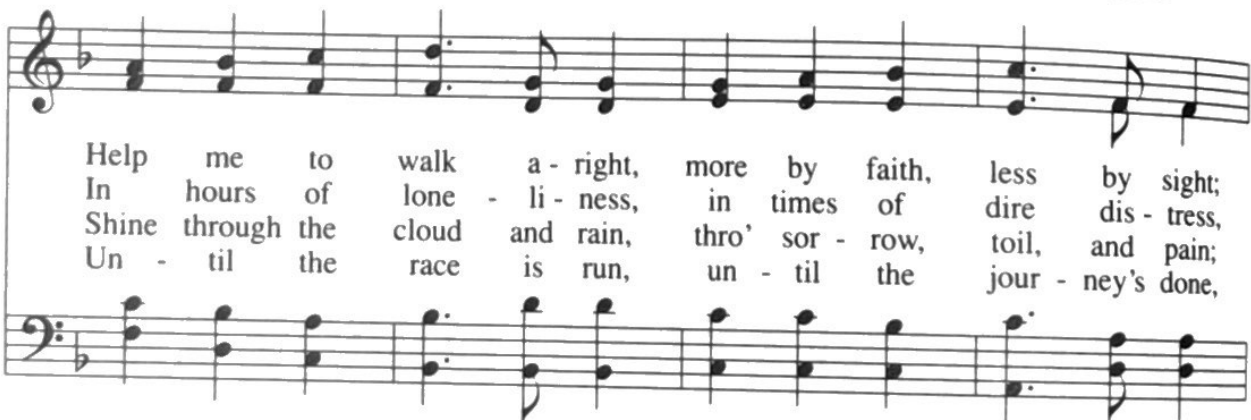
Teach Me Thy Way, O Lord

Teach me your way, O LORD; lead me in a straight path. Ps. 27:11

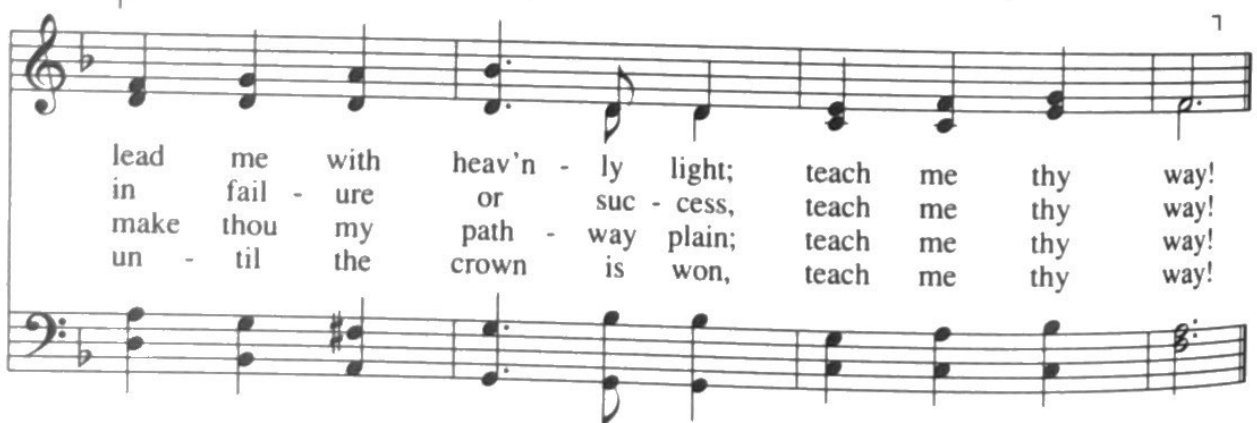

1. Teach me thy way, O Lord; teach me thy way!
