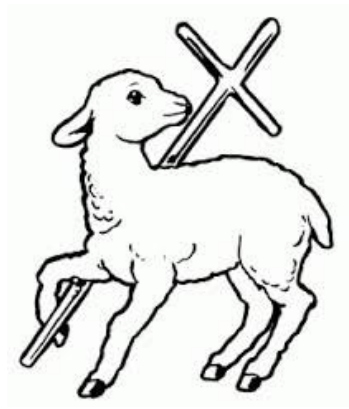


The passage which the nobleman did not understand was this:
